>>> MEET THE TEAM:

New in 2024, Aiko, Cicely, Leslee, Sakshi & Sneha are already off to a flying start in Green Impact! They held their first GI event in early May; a screening of 'Climate change or politics? Why Madagascar is going hungry'. They have already held a second lunchtime screening to raise awareness of eco-ableism. Most of this team are studying global public health and are a part of the Planetary Health Alliance (<u>https://www.planetaryhealthalliance.org/</u>).

>>> ABOUT THE SCREENING:

The short film was presented over lunch, highlighting the complex issues that surround water scarcity in southern Madagascar. It highlighted social and political challenges, which were then discussed following the screening. Points raised included the interconnectedness between loss of biodiversity and political challenges faced by the communities in the film. Members also discussed social & political tensions in their home countries & how to bring awareness to the issues discussed and how to bring about positive sustainable change.

GET INVOLVED:

GRIFFITH REPAIR CAFE NEEDS YOUR HELP!

Some of you met Leanne Wiseman in last months GI Gathering. Her current research is centered around the international Right to Repair movement and her and her amazing colleagues have been instrumental in the development of the <u>Australian Repair Network</u>.



>>> WHAT IS A REPAIR CAFE?

Put simply, they are a space (permanent or pop-up) where people can take their broken items for repair. Think clothing, electronics, whitegoods etc. How many items do we throw out simply because we are incapable of repairing them ourselves? Imagine if you could get your items repaired instead of disposing of them - saving you money, reducing landfill and other environmental problems. The Griffith University Repair Cafe travels between all campuses each trimester to help you give your items a second life!

>>> HOW TO GET INVOLVED:

There are a few different ways to get involved, starting with promoting repair cafe pop-ups on campus and dropping by to get an item fixed (B058).

Better yet, become part of the solution. For those that are handy with the sewing machine, love tinkering with electronics or really enjoy problem-solving, the Repair Cafe team are always looking for volunteers. RUTH'S MENTORING TIPS:

It can often be challenging to communicate about Green Impact outside of your direct team. Here we have recapped Ruth's top tips for spreading the word (repeat from one of the Gatherings last month so that we are all up-to-speed).

- Ensure that GI is a regular topic on team meetings to plan events and delegate responsibilities.
- Ask for a regular topic in newsletter emails, even 5 minutes is manageable.
- Use unique to your advantage. For example, Boronia & Tallowwood are an ELC and so children created artwork posters to advertise events.
- Create information boards for display in your area to promote actions & events!
- Make events and plans fun and ensure small success, quickly to promote engagement!
- Have informal discussions to brainstorm other wildcard events, again, using your team's uniqueness to your advantage!
