>>> MEET THE TEAM:

The Green Library team consists of our University Librarian Maureen, Sara, Catherine, Kysira, Donald, Leanne, Ameeta, Zoe, Michelle, Sharron, Alex, Jessie, Sophie, and Ryan. The Library has about 111 staff (102.4 FTE) and works online and across all campuses, so activities like Green Impact bring library staff together.

GI HIGHLIGHTS: **>>>**

The team have held two fundraisers so far this year, Pride Morning Tea for the Open Doors Youth Service, and a Wear Spots and Stripes Day for Indigenous Literacy Fund. They had allyship bracelet making, pronoun badge making, Pride Trivia, and a book display of LGBTIQ+ resources. Last week they broke their goal of \$350 to raise over \$660 for the Indigenous Literacy Fund!

>>> 2024 GOALS:

The team started this year's Green Impact with a schedule of all the timed events and planned tasks to hit for each month's meeting with the hope that of reaching platinum. The team intends to keep the momentum going through the colder months, knowing it can often be a busy time of year.

>>> A CULTURALLY RESPECTFUL LIBRARY:

Griffith Library has been working to embed Griffith's Reconciliation Statement commitment into their department in a meaningful way. Aligning with National Sorry Day on May 24th, the library launched its <u>Culturally Respectful Library</u> webpage. Library staff worked on personalising Acknowledgments of Country, including a library-specific Acknowledgement to ensure their services are inclusive and apply appropriate cultural protocols.

Don't be overwhelmed by the idea of removing plastic completely this month. Instead, choose to swap when you can based on your personal circumstances! Our GI Mentor, Ruth, has some great swaps listed below:

UNDERSTANDING WILDCARDS:

Wildcard actions are an opportunity for teams to:

- · get creative about ways to implement sustainability into their lives
- focus on their niche areas/department
- use the resources at their disposal, which other teams may not have access to.

Basically, if you have a great sustainability idea that is not covered in the toolkit already, a wildcard is your chance to implement it. Here are some guidelines for which wildcard is most appropriate for your action:

- · Bronze wildcard actions (5 points) are about promoting.
- · Silver wildcard actions (10 points) are about engaging.
- · Gold wildcard actions (15 points) are about actioning.
- Platinum wildcard actions (20 points) are about all of the above, over an extended period of time.
