TEAM ARTICLES

GRIFFITH UNIVERSITY REPAIR CAFE

Our Griffith University Repair Cafe team has participated in the Green Impact challenge last year so this is our second year of participating. We organise and run Repair Cafes on each of our University campuses. These events are very popular with students and staff as they help to reduce waste, save money and build a community of repair skills and knowledge and promotes the move to a circular economy.

2024 Highlights include:

- · Working as a team to achieve a Gold Award
- Developed a model to establish and run Repair Cafes on our campuses for our students, staff and community
- We all worked together as repairers and helpers to promote the Repair Cafe on our campuses

Our Repair Cafe events have:

- · helped staff and students to save money
- · reducing waste by fixing the things we own
- provides an opportunity for students to apply their academic knowledge in a practical way
- built a community where students and staff can share knowledge of repair skills.

Lessons we have learned:

- to make sure that there is enough lead time to recruit our volunteers and advertise the cafes
- to build up enough volunteers so that there is not too much demand on individuals' time
- to offer the Repair Cafe on Market Days or when there are other events on campus to increase awareness and foot traffic
- to celebrate each repair for saving waste from landfill
- · to ensure our venues are accessible & visible
- to gather data on the number of items brought in, the success rate of repair and gather feedback on visitor's experience as this helps the broader Right to Repair movement by identifying the barriers to repair.

GREEN LIBRARY

This year for the Green Impact program the Green Library team has been busy spreading the word about Green Impact and supporting the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). We've also been highlighting how you can incorporate impactful yet easy SGD awareness activities into your life. Since we started on March 7th this year we've made some significant gains in supporting the SDGs. Here are our top five activities:

- Celebrated NAIDOC Week and promoted our work in creating the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Research Guide with the Indigenous Research Unit (IRU) and the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Reading list with Ren Perkins. - We contributed to improving literacy for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples across
 Australia by raising money for the <u>Indigenous Literacy Foundation</u> (ILF). Our dress in Stripes or
 Spots Day raised \$660 for the ILF! SGD 4 SDG 10
- Across the Library we promoted and supported the Student Food Pantry. Each campus Library
 had collection points and the food we donated helped stock the food pantry supporting our

- On June 19th we threw a Pride Morning Tea. A great chance to celebrate and support the diversity
 we have within the Library & across the university. Aside from a fun and entertaining morning tea,

- We also undertook a diverse range of skill and knowledge development. Various members of the team undertook MATE Bystander training, Cultural Competency training and Staff Ally training, building on our understanding and ability to provide safe, inclusive and empathetic services. 




HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR TOOLKIT:
