MASTERS DEGREE (COURSEWORK)

PURPOSE

The Masters Degree (Coursework) qualifies individuals who apply an advanced body of knowledge in a range of contexts for professional practice or scholarship and as a pathway for further learning

KNOWLEDGE

Graduates of a Masters Degree (Coursework) will have:

- a body of knowledge that includes the understanding of recent developments in a discipline and/or area of professional practice
- knowledge of research principles and methods applicable to a field of work and or learning

Graduates of the Master of Professional Psychology will have advanced and integrated knowledge of psychological practice as required by the Australian Psychology Accreditation Council (APAC) guidelines including advanced knowledge of

- ethical, legal and professional matters relevant to practice as a psychologist
- mental health, including psychological disorders across the lifespan
- psychological testing in the context of comprehensive assessment across the lifespan
- psychological intervention across the lifespan
- frameworks to evaluate their professional practice.

SKILLS

Graduates of a Masters Degree (Coursework) will have:

- cognitive skills to demonstrate mastery of theoretical knowledge and to reflect critically on theory and professional practice or scholarship
- cognitive, technical and creative skills to investigate, analyse and synthesise complex information, problems, concepts and theories and to apply established theories to different bodies of knowledge or practice
- cognitive, technical and creative skills to generate and evaluate complex

Graduates of the Master of Professional Psychology will have advanced cognitive, communication and technical skills for professional practice in psychology to:

- critically analyse and apply evidence-based and scientific methods to professional practice across the lifespan in empirically valid and culturally responsive ways
- employ professional communication skills, in a culturally responsive manner, with a range of socially and culturally diverse clients
- interpret and communicate assessment findings, treatment progress and other clientrelated matters, in oral and written formats using culturally appropriate language
- develop and maintain respectful and effective interpersonal relationships with clients,
 support staff and other professionals required for the practice of psychology
- operate within the boundaries of their professional competence and to consult with peers or other relevant practitioners, where appropriate
- conduct comprehensive assessment, including the assessment of risk and use of



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- communication and technical research skills to justify and interpret theoretical propositions, methodologies, conclusions and professional decisions to specialist and non-specialist audiences
- technical and communication skills to design, evaluate, implement, analyse and theorise about developments that contribute to professional practice or scholarship

standardised measures (if required), to formulate the presenting problem of an individual, family, group or organisation

- plan and provide formulation-driven interventions for individuals, families, groups or organisations
- monitor progress and outcome to allow for and respond to an evolving case formulation
- engage in self-reflective professional practice.

APPLICATION OF KNOWLEDGE & SKILLS

Graduates of a Masters Degree (Coursework) will demonstrate the application of knowledge & skills:

- with creativity and initiative to new situations in professional practice and/or for further learning
- with high level personal autonomy and accountability
- to plan and execute a substantial research-based project, capstone experience and/or piece of scholarship

Graduates of the Master of Professional Psychology will demonstrate initiative and a high level of personal responsibility to practice as a psychologist to:

- engage in lifelong learning through professional development and supervision
- work collaboratively with other professionals in their work
- complete the +1-internship program as outlined by the Psychology Board of Australia to complete their registration as a psychologist.
- complete an ethically designed, conducted, interpreted and communicated research project that investigates a substantial individual research question relevant to their practice as a psychologist.
